### 'Third of UK workers think boss is unfair'



***One in three workers in Britain does not view their employer as fair, according to new figures.***

A GfK Fairness Survey, sponsored by GoodCorporation, has revealed that staff in professional service firms were most likely to consider their bosses to be unfair, with 39 per cent reporting such misgivings.

People working in this sector expressed concerns over the clarity and fairness of pay, as well as the existence of bullying and harassment.

The most just sector, on the other hand, was found to be state schools and colleges, with more than 70 per cent of employees working in such jobs describing their bosses as fair.

"I welcome the findings of GoodCorporation's Mirror Mirror survey, but was disappointed to see Professional Services companies performing so badly," stated Lord Sharman, chairman of Aviva and former global head of KPMG.

Research released this week by Investors in People revealed that 78 per cent of employees do not trust their managers.
